Note: This is not an exhaustive list of reporting deadlines. Facility-specific requirements and deadlines may vary. Trinity suggests checking with local regulators for submission deadlines. Submit or postmark reports by the due date for on-time consideration. If due date falls on a weekend or holiday, Trinity recommends you submit or postmark the prior business day.

¹ Reporting due dates are based on effective date of your permit and could be due either January and July or April and October.

² Usually submitted with Semi-annual Title V Compliance Report due in January and July or April and October. Some could be off-set per specific NESHAP. Subpart FFFF (MON) for example is February and August.

³ Reports due 30 days of the end of each calendar quarter.

⁴ Reporting due dates are based on effective date of your permit and could be due either February, May, August, or November.

⁵ EPA has proposed moving the 2025 GHGRP deadline to June 10, 2026 and eliminating most reporting requirements after 2024 (with Subpart W suspended until 2034). Until finalized, current March 31 deadlines remain in effect. See details at [Rulemaking Notices for GHG Reporting | US EPA](#).

⁷ Submissions now due by October 13, 2026 for most manufacturers and by April 13, 2027 for small manufacturers reporting exclusively as importers. Exemptions and modification have been proposed.

⁸ Usually submitted with Semi-annual Title V Compliance Report due in January and July or April and October.

⁹ Per NPDES permit. Electronic submittals (DMR) via SCDES e-permitting portal due 30 days after monitoring period ends (monthly, quarterly, semi annual, annual or once per permit term).

¹⁰ Due every even-numbered year (for example, a report due by March 1, 2026, would report activities from calendar year 2025).
